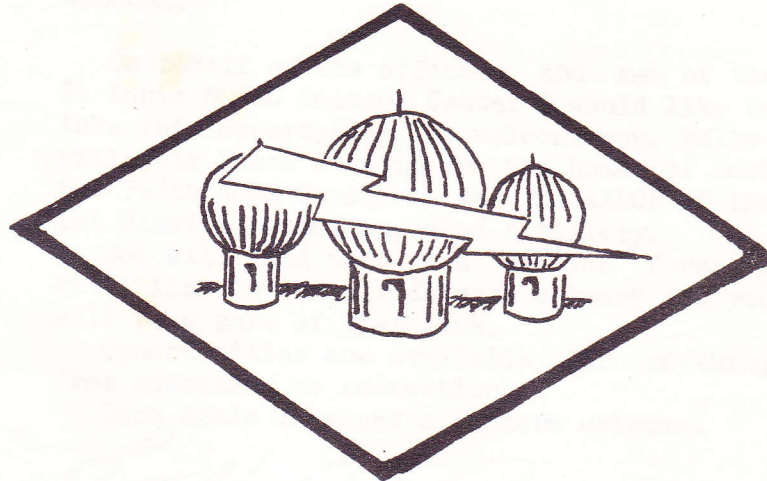

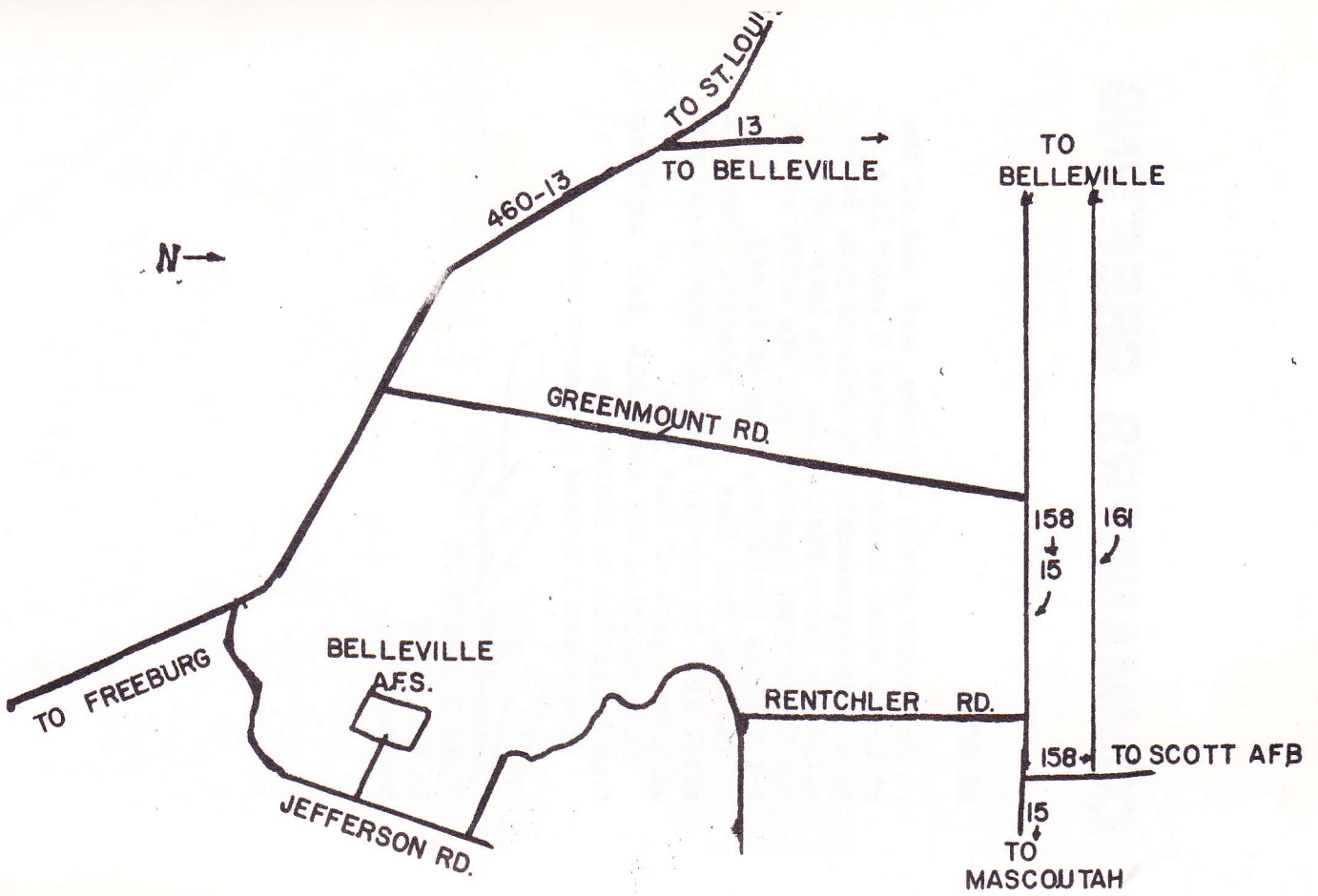
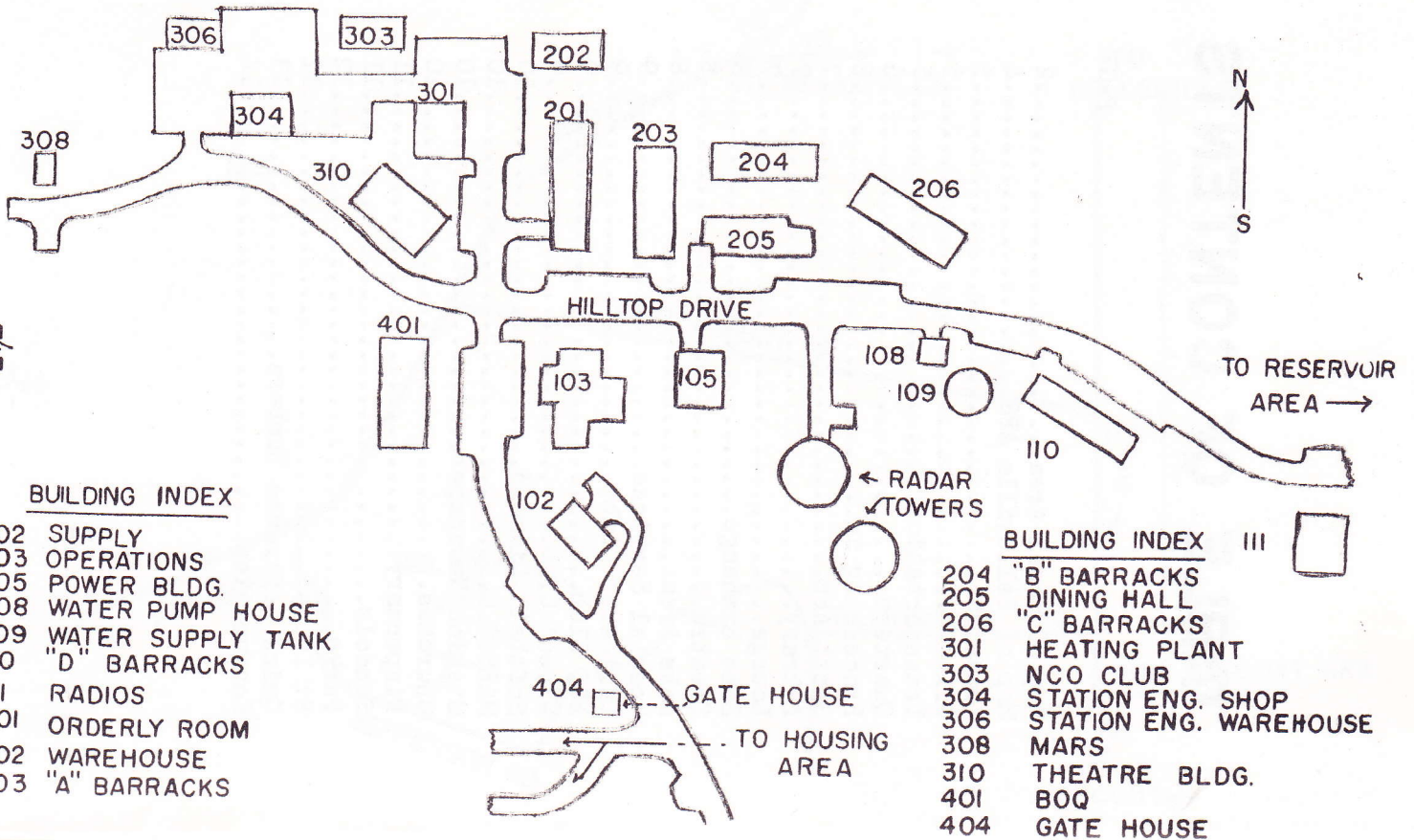

LOCATION

Belleville AF Station is located approximately six miles southeast of Belleville, Illinois and twenty-five miles southeast of St Louis, Missouri. It is approximately four miles north of Freeburg. A sign directs the required turn from US Highway 460.

CLIMATE

The area's mean annual temperature is 56.3 degrees. The average for winter is 31.5 degrees and summer temperatures average 77.9 degrees. The average annual precipitation is 38.7 inches.

Optional dates for winter uniform are from 15 April to 14 May and from 1 October to 31 October. Dates for mandatory wear of the winter uniform run from 1 November to 14 April.

TRANSPORTATION

Four railroads (the Illinois Central, Louisville & Nashville, the St Louis & Belleville Electric and the Southern) are routed through Belleville. Belleville include Bus companies serving Belleville include

the Greyhound Lines, the O'Fallon-Belleville Coach Company and the Belleville-St Louis Coach Company.

Air facilities into St Louis include American Airlines, Braniff International Airways, Eastern Air Lines, Ozark Air Lines and Trans-World Airlines.

A Belleville cab company is the only commercial link between Belleville and the station. No bus lines are available.

QUARTERS

There are four BAQs and a BOQ on station. The BAQs each have an automatic washer and drier set. In addition there are 27 sets of family quarters (9 officer and 18 NCO).

Wherry housing may be had at Scott AFB. Scott Also has a trailer park.

PROCESSING IN

All personnel reporting into the squadron will do so in uniform. During duty hours they will report to the Orderly Room, Building 201. After duty hours the Officer of the Day will be contacted upon arrival on station.

All vehicles must be registered with the Provost Marshal section. After registration is completed you will be required to have a vehicle safety check prior to receiving a station decal. Minimum insurance coverage is \$10,000/20,000/5,000.

Privately owned firearms must also be registered with the Provost Marshal.

SCOTT AFB

Scott AF Base is support base for the station. Personnel and their dependents are allowed full use of any facilities or services available there. These include Base Exchange, Commissary, Cafeterias, Bowling Alley, Hobby Shop, Swimming Pool, Clothing Sales Store, Theatres, Thrift Shop, Gymnasium, Library, Nursery, Hospital, Service Station and Open Messes.

LIBRARY

A library is located in Building 310. A collection of over 800 books covering a wide range of subjects is held. The latest magazines and newspapers may be found in the station lounge located in building 201.

LOUNGE

A comfortable lounge is maintained by the Information Office in building 201. Here a bulletin board with the latest news is kept up to date and the latest magazines and newspapers are available to all personnel.

BX

Operating hours for the small BX on station are 1200 to 1300 and 1700 to 2000 hours each duty day. Saturday hours are 1700 to 2000 hours. The BX is well stocked with small items and also handles dry cleaning through Belleville. The exchange is located in building 310.

THEATRE

The latest movies are shown three nights a week (Monday, Wednesday and Friday) at 1800 hours in the theatre, Building 310.

Admission is as follows:

Adults - \$0.25

Children - \$0.15

LAKE

The 798th is one of the only squadrons in ADC that boasts of its own lake on station. The lake and lake area are open to all personnel of the station and their guests. Fishing is excellent and picnic facilities are available lakeside.

SPORTS EQUIPMENT

Sports equipment, golf clubs and many other items may be checked out from Special Services by all personnel.

OFFICERS CLUB

The Officers' Club is located on the second floor of the BOQ, Building 401. Television, hi-fi and a lounge are available.

NCO CLUB

Building 303 is the NCO Club. An active social schedule is maintained. Airmen may join the club as associate members.

WIVES' CLUBS

Officers' and NCOs' Wives Clubs are active on station and hold regular meetings. An active program is carried on by both clubs.

SOFTBALL DIAMOND

A softball diamond is located west of the MARS station.

MARS

A MARS station is maintained in building 308 and is a part of the net linking the squadrons of the Kansas City Air Defense Sector.

STATION NEWSPAPER

Belleville AFS publishes its own newspaper, the Turkey Hill Times. It is a Class I paper and is made available through distribution to all personnel.

CHURCHES

Within Belleville there are 43 Protestant and 8 Catholic churches. There is also a Jewish temple. Scott AFB has two chapels to serve the religious needs of personnel serving here.

DISPENSARY

Sick call is from 0800 to 1100 and 1300 to 1600 hours each working day. A small dispensary is maintained by this squadron. The medical technician gives aid for minor illnesses, emergency and first aid. He also takes care of almost all military immunizations.

Cases indicating services of a physician are referred to Scott AF Base for appointment.

Dependents care is referred directly to Scott's dispensary and all appointments are made directly by them.

SCHOOLS

Persons living in Belleville, Illinois would be expected to send their children to the Belleville Elementary and High School. There is also Belleville Junior College which provides tuition free the first two years of most college degree courses to residents of Belleville. This includes military personnel living within the city.

Persons living in Lebanon, O'Fallon or Freeburg also have their school systems available.

Parochial elementary schools are available in Belleville, East St Louis and for a limited

number of students in O'Fallon, Lebanon, Freeburg and Mascoutah. Parochial high schools are available in Belleville and East St Louis.

In St Louis, Missouri there are St Louis University and Washington University both providing the highest type of training leading to a Bachelor, Master or a Doctorate degree in any field of study.

PARKS

Grand Mareis State Park is in St Clair County four miles east of East St Louis on State Route 15. The park contains 125 acres including an 18 hole golf course, horseback riding, picnic areas and playgrounds, motor boat riding, fishing and ball parks.

Bellevue Park on North 48th Street in Belleville has picnic tables, pit and a shelter house where soda and snacks are available.

ST. LOUIS

St Louis, Missouri is located approximately twenty-five miles northwest of the station. It has all the activities and entertainment media of a large city.

Busch Stadium, the home of the St Louis Cardinals, is a mecca for baseball fans during the summer months and football fans the win-

ter months.

Kiel Auditorium serves both as a musical and a basketball center for the city. The St Louis Symphony Orchestra presents its many programs here. Professional basketball with the St Louis Hawks and college basketball with St Louis University is played here.

Forest Park, located in the western half of the city, is world famous for its Municipal Opera and its zoo. A new ice skating rink is also open during the winter months.

COMMUNITIES

BELLEVILLE

Belleville is a striking example of the polyglot that has been characteristic of the American freedom.

Bearing a French name, populated largely by people of German extraction, it was actually founded by that group known only as Americans.

Belleville is today the seat of St Clair County, second largest in Illinois. Incorporated as a village in 1819 and chartered as a city in 1850 it has grown to a population of approximately 40,000.

Over fifty manufacturing establishments are operating in and near Belleville because of the city's location in the heart of one of America's leading commercial and agricultural districts.

FREEBURG

The city of Freeburg, established in 1855, is 25 miles southeast of St Louis, Missouri and nine miles from Belleville, Illinois. It is three miles from Belleville Air Force Station. Those who live in Freeburg are privileged to drive both ways with the sun at their back.

Facilities are currently available to provide public utility services. There is adequate police and fire protection.

MASCOUTAH

The community of Mascoutah, Illinois is well within the development stage. It has planned a 46 acre city park, wider streets, a city beautifying program and other desirable features.

It is the only small community in the area to have compiled their own guide to their own community. It may be obtained from most of the local merchants.

LEBANON

Lebanon, Illinois was incorporated as a town in May of 1857 and as a city in August 1874.

It is most widely known as the site of McKendree College, founded here in 1828.

A few years ago the city was granted a park. The park will be left in a wild state except for the construction of a lake.
